

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

This quilt uses **Flying Geese Units (FGU)** to make this quilt.

The "stitch and flip" method of Flying Geese Unit construction is used in this pattern.

A more fabric efficient way to cut the Flying Geese Units is to use a special piecing template.

American Hero Stars / Scrappy Stars Quilt

Items you will need for the quilting -

Thread - Use whatever thread works in your quilting machine and we will be using a few different threads for this project. Here are some suggestions for thread.

Feather Quilting - For this quilt, we WANT the quilting to show! For the feather work I highly recommend using a contrasting thread color for the quilting!

Background Fabric Quilting - we do want our feather quilting to "show" but we don't want the quilting to overwhelm the piecing. I recommend a contrasting thread that is a few shades darker than your background fabric.

Border Fabric Quilting - because the border fabric is much darker than the background fabric, I would recommend a thread that DOES contrast a lot! This is where we DO want the quilting to show!

Star Block Quilting - choose a thread that coordinates with the fabrics in the star. For the American Hero Stars quilt, you may choose a thread for the blue on the flag and another color for the stripes. For the Scrappy Stars quilt, choose a thread that coordinates with the fabrics in the star.

Fill In Stitching - For the background, fill in stitching use a thread that matches your fabric. We want this quilting to "disappear" into the fabric.

We are also going to be making registration lines on the fabric and a contrasting thread will make your quilting "stand out" and be much easier to see!

Marking Pens. I prefer the Fine Point Crayola Washable Markers. Note - to remove the marker, the quilt **MUST** be washed in warm water, with detergent, in a washing machine.

There is going to be a **LOT** of marking on this quilt and we will be using different color markers for marking different areas / designs. **I suggest getting a brand new set of the Crayola Washable Markers**.

Straight edge rotary cutting rulers for marking registration lines.

Piecing template material - We are going to be making templates which we will be drawing around and using as quilting guides. These templates work best if they are made from **PIECING plastic** template material. This material can be found in most quilting and chain fabric stores.

IMPORTANT - I have found that **HEAVY DUTY** template plastic works best. I recommend Dritz Heavy Duty Template Plastic which comes in a 12×18 inch sheet. The templates we need can be cut from 1×18 sheet of this plastic.

If you can't find this type of template plastic, that's ok. Your templates may be a bit "floppy" but they will work!
