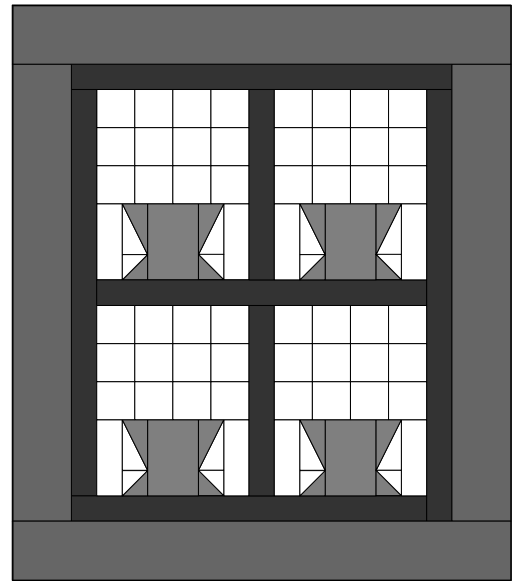

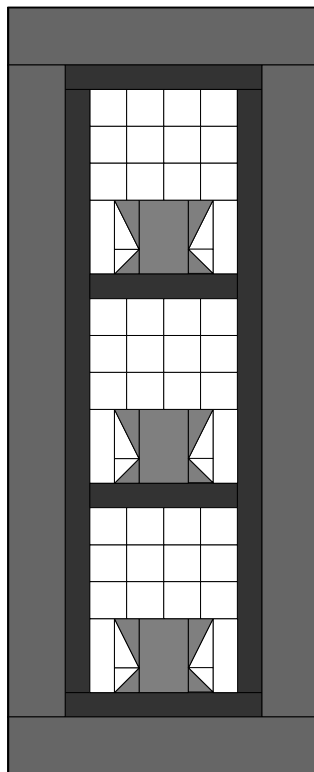
Single Basket
38 x 42 inches



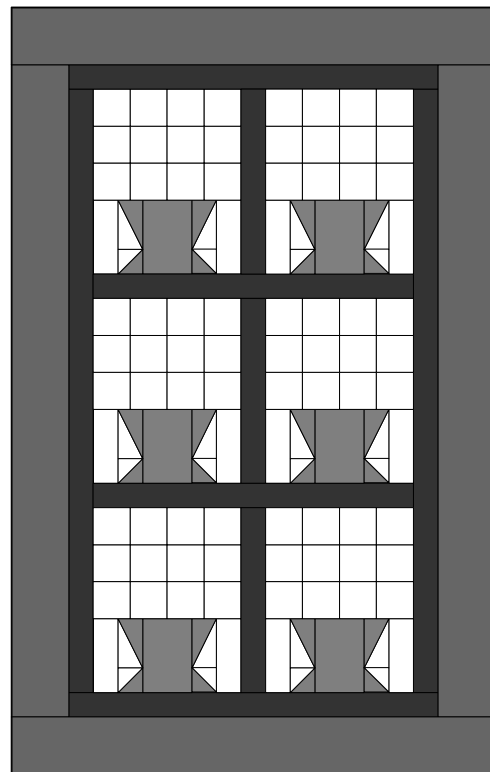
2 Baskets

61 x 70 inches



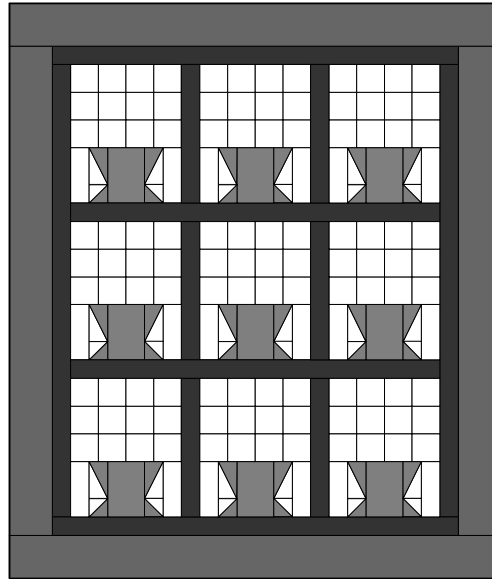
3 Baskets

Flower Basket Quilt Yardage Amounts

Note: Amounts are generous

Note - For this quilt, the QUILTING is the star!! Choose a Light / Background fabric that is a solid or "reads" like a solid fabric. **We want the quilting to show!** If you choose a busy print or a large scale print fabric, you will not be able to see the texture of the quilting.

***Basket Handles** are optional. You get to choose how many baskets the handles are applied to! Handles can be applied to all the baskets or only a few baskets. Allow about 1 Fat Quarter (FQ) per basket. You can use the same fabric as the baskets or use a different fabric for the handles.

**Flowers, Stems and Leafs

Flowers - I would recommend several different colors / fabrics for the flowers and at least two colors / fabrics for the leaves. The more colors / fabrics, the more vibrant your flowers will be.

From 1 (one) FQ you can get up to -
16 large / outer flowers OR 25 inner / smaller flowers.

Allow for up to 10 or more flowers per basket.

Stems - will be cut on the bias in varying lengths depending where the flowers are placed. I would recommend at least 1 FQ per block of stem fabric. To keep things interesting, I would recommend 2 or 3 different colors / fabrics for stems.

Leafs - I recommend at least 2, possibly 3 or more green / green-ish colors / fabrics for the leafs. The leafs are more of an accent piece. Allow about 6 - 8 leaves per block, 1 or 2 FQ's will make a LOT of leafs!

Many of the Basket Handle, Flower, Stem and Leaves fabric can be found in your stash or in your scrap piles! Use the fabric you have on hand.

Remember, this is a NATURE inspired project. There are MANY funky colors and color combinations in Nature!

Flower Basket Quilt

Note: The Basket sides are made from elongated triangles. The piecing instructions for this project are written so that you don't have to use any special piecing rulers. If you would prefer use special piecing rulers to make the elongated triangles, I recommend the following:

Both of these template sets are available through Longarm University or your local quilt shop.

Items you will need for the quilting -

Thread - Use whatever thread works in your quilting machine. Below are some suggestions for thread.

Background - I recommend using a thread that blends into the background fabric. We want the texture of the quilting to show, but not the actual quilting.

Borders and Sashings - I am using a contrasting thread in the borders and sashings. I DO want my quilting to show in these areas!

Flowers, Stems and Leafs - Depending of the colors of your flower fabrics, you may want to change colors of thread when quilting the flowers. Or, you may be able to one color of thread on several of the flowers. Do what ever works best you.

Temporary Quilt Basting Spray - I prefer the June Taylor brand, but any brand will work.

Marking pens of choice. I prefer the Fine Point Crayola Washable Markers. Note - to remove the marker, the quilt **MUST** be washed in warm water, with detergent, in a washing machine.

Straight edge rotary cutting rulers for marking registration lines.

Safety pins for pin basting.

Piecing template material - We are going to be making templates which we will be drawing around and using as quilting guides. These templates work best if they are made from PIECING plastic template material. This material can be found in most quilting and chain fabric stores.

IMPORTANT - The templates we will be making are up to 14 inches wide. I have found that HEAVY DUTY template plastic works best. I recommend Dritz Heavy Duty Template Plastic which comes in a 12 x 18 inch sheet. All the templates we need can be cut from 1 sheet of this plastic.

If you can't find this type of template plastic, that's ok. Your templates may be a bit "floppy" but they will work!
